
4 GIRLS RESCUED IN CHINA

Girls from Laos are being trafficked to China for the purpose of child marriage. Because of the one child policy in China, there is a shortage of wives. Free a Girl rescues these children and educate them to become watch dogs within their own community. Former victims of child marriage become change makers and prevent other girls being sold to Chinese men.

NEPAL RESCUES

In Nepal we rescue children from the sex industry within the entertainment sector, we also rescue Nepali girls

from the sex industry in India. Free a Girl prevents trafficking of girls/women at the border, intercept them and provide comprehensive services including food, shelter, pyschosocial counseling, legal counseling and trainings.



- 449 girls/boys and women rescued at the borders
- 38 girls and women rescued from a brothel
- 12 people arrested



SCHOOL FOR JUSTICE NEPAL

Within the School for Justice programme we educate survicors to become change agents and provide them with an education in human rights related studies like law and journalism.

UKRAINE



The war in Ukraine poses an immediate and growing threat to the lives and well[1]being of the country's 7.5 million children. More than a million refugees have been forced to flee Ukraine seeking safety and protection. Hundreds of thousands of them are children, including unaccompanied children.

- 300 food and hygiëne packets were distributed to children
- 18 children and 9 women received psycho-social help or medical assistance (victims of violence and/or abuse)
- 12 orphans were transported to safe shelters
- 32 children received rehabilitation services in 3 different institutions
- Free a Girl provided an undercover agent and online investigation tools to search for vicitms of sexual exploitation trafficked to other countries
